Volunteers in Medicine (Bend, OR) seeks a part-time, personable, experienced pharmacist for its in-clinic pharmacy. The Staff Pharmacist will supervise staff and volunteer pharmacy technicians, interns, and clerks and comply with pharmaceutical company regulations and all state and federal laws. Additional duties may include recruiting and scheduling volunteer pharmacists and pharmacy technicians, maintaining and ensuring the security and storage of inventory, and work closely with on-site medical providers and VIM staff regarding operations and patient care.

Requirements

- Applicants must have a valid Oregon pharmacist license in good standing; and have two years of experience as a pharmacist, preferably in retail or ambulatory care settings.
- Bilingual in Spanish preferred, but not required.
- The successful candidate will possess strong problem-solving and communications skills, demonstrate a compassionate and respectful attitude towards all people, be comfortable with computer-based medical record systems and office software, have excellent organizational skills, and be comfortable with teaching and training.

Position Specifics:

- The position will be 8 hours per week, with no weekend hours.
- Staff position may share hours and responsibilities with another staff pharmacist in a job-sharing model.
