Charles grew up in Chiapas, Mexico, near the Guatemalan border. He loved going to the fields to play and used to help with planting and caring for his family's cattle. Although Chiapas has grown, it still looks beautiful, and he misses seeing it. He later moved to Mexico City, where he built most of his life. His children and their families still live there.

There came a time when his sister invited him to visit Sisters, Oregon, and two months later, he moved to there! He works in hotel maintenance and does odd jobs all year round. In his free time, he likes to be with friends and have a couple of beers.

Charles heard about VIM through a friend who volunteers at the clinic. He's been coming to VIM for five years, and the volunteers and staff have helped him manage his diabetes, control his blood pressure and cholesterol, get eye and teeth exams, and receive his medications. He also got vaccinated with VIM's help, because he wanted to reduce his risk of getting really sick if he got COVID. His experience at VIM has been very good, noting, "I would be pretty bad off if I didn't receive care here. I'm very grateful for VIM and the kindness I've received from all the staff and volunteers."

Lilian: Entrepreneur and Community Advocate

Lilian Chu grew up in Hong Kong before moving to Corvallis, Oregon. In 1976, Lilian and her husband were taking a road trip around Oregon when they stopped at the Deschutes river near Bend. They instantly fell in love with the area and all it had to offer, and a short while after that trip, made Bend their home.

After moving, Lilian and her husband opened a restaurant, which had been his lifelong dream. This dream turned reality led to Lilian becoming a business consultant and co-owner of three Bend restaurants. Lilian's connection to Bend runs deep and

she believes in a community business model centered around giving back and helping the local area. One of the many ways in which she practices this is with her long-standing support of VIM and other nonprofits around Central Oregon.

Lilian originally heard about VIM through the clinic's former medical director and emeritus board member, Dr. Bob Hakala, who was her family physician at the time. Her history started with her volunteer work in 2007, where she did everything from interpreting (Mandarin and Cantonese) to hosting fundraising events at 5 Fusion & Sushi Bar.

She loves that VIM provides such high-quality care to the working class and those who slip through the cracks in the medical system. She's thrilled at the number of services VIM offers patients and the sheer number of people the clinic helps. The sense of community between the individuals involved with VIM extends beyond the medical field: Lilian recalls when another former medical director, Dr. Ron Carver, helped her get her car unstuck one snowy day at the clinic. Lilian says, "I want to give a big shoutout to all of the staff, volunteers, and community partners who make VIM such an integral part of Central Oregon and who have made this such an amazing community to live in over the years."

Current Board Members Move into Board Leadership Roles

As of January 1st, VIM welcomed two current board members into Leadership roles.

Erika McCalpine - Board Chair

Erika McCalpine is the Executive Director of Strategic Diversity Initiatives at OSU-Cascades, and the director of the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Laboratory. She is also a business instructor, where she teaches courses in human resources, business ethics, leadership and entrepreneurship.

McCalpine is a recognized advocate for advancing social equity and inclusion within OSU and weaves those themes throughout her teaching and in her work with students. In 2019 she received the OSU Frances Dancy Hooks Award for building bridges across cultures and showing courage in promoting diversity. She received the OSU-Cascades Diversity Award in 2019.



McCalpine is involved with shared governance serving as a faculty senate senator (2019), executive committee member (2020), and president-elect (2021). She is the first person from OSU-Cascades to be elected to lead the faculty senate. McCalpine will assume the presidency in 2022.

McCalpine's community service includes positions on the boards of directors of Volunteers in Medicine since 2019 and of the City Club of Central Oregon since 2020. She is the co-founder of Love Your Neighbor, a grassroots effort that encourages community members to appreciate and accept fellow residents from diverse backgrounds. She was named the Source Weekly Woman of the Year in 2019.

Prior to joining OSU-Cascades, McCalpine taught at the University of Alabama, where she was awarded the Morrissette Award for Excellence in Teaching Leadership and Ethics, and the J. Craig Smith Integrity Award. McCalpine also attended the University of Alabama where she earned degrees in Management with specialties in Human Resources and Organizational Behavior. She also earned a certification in Diversity and Inclusion from Cornell University. McCalpine is a member of the Society of Human Resource Management and the National Center for Faculty Development and Diversity.

Tyler Fix DMD - Vice Chair

As a dental partner offering pro bono care to VIM's patients since 2017, Tyler was given the privilege of joining VIM's Board of Directors in October 2020. Tyler transitioned into the role of Vice Chair in January 2022. He works as a private practice dentist four days a week with PureCare Dental of Bend. When caring for VIM patients, he aims to humanize and personalize their dental experiences with an open ear, an open mind, and an open heart. He is an advocate for expanding VIM's dental healthcare presence in the community.

Among other accomplishments, Tyler is an Oregon Dental Association's Leadership Academy Alumni Class of 2019, Leadership Bend Alumni Class of 2020, Councilman on the Oregon Dental Association's New Dentist Council from 2019 to 2021, and the recipient of Cascade Business News: Accomplished Under 40 Award (2020). In his free time, he enjoys playing tennis, skiing, hiking, and volunteering.

Patient Story: Finding Safety and Peace

Julieta grew up in Mexico City in an area that was very serene and had a very small population when she was a child. As the area grew and started to get crowded, that peace began to disappear. On one of the occasions when her neighbors began fighting with the police, her husband, Roberto, suggested they move to the states. They wanted to try it out to see if they could make a better life for themselves here.

Roberto moved to Central Oregon in 1991, and Julieta followed close behind. Roberto started working in a relative's restaurant, and they raised a family together. Later, Roberto began training alpacas for shows, Julieta says, "Being out on the ranch and

working with animals is much more satisfying for him, and he's glad he made the change." More recently, due to a severe case of COVID and resulting serious complications, Julieta is not able to work. She's stuck at home on oxygen, unable to speak without it. Day by day she's feeling a bit better, which she says, "is all I can ask for".

Julieta has been using VIM as a resource since 2004, when a member of her church told her about the options VIM offered to those without healthcare. Through the many years she's been a patient at VIM, she's loved the personalized care she's received and feels that everyone at the clinic genuinely cares about her. VIM's Nurse Manager, Jennifer Fuller will even call her at home to check up on her. She sees all the volunteers and staff at VIM as a great blessing to her and to our community.

"From the moment that you enter, the kindness there makes you feel really good. They make you feel valued. They make you feel that they are genuinely concerned for your health, your life. It makes me so happy, it fills me up, because they demonstrate this. The doctors have never abandoned me, they're always checking in on me. They're always checking my blood pressure. The best thing that could have happened to me in my life - someone who cares about my health. Imagine! What a gift for a human being!" - Julieta



Tony and Janet Kronemeyer have traveled wherever the winds would take them. Hawaii, Mexico, Arizona, and everywhere in between, before finally settling down permanently in Sisters, where they've been for three years. They've had a lot of adventures and have moved their appropriately named clothing store, Gypsy Wind Clothing, with them throughout their travels, and now too, in Sisters.

For many years they couldn't afford medical insurance and were incredibly grateful to have had good health through most of their journey. Even still, the



thought that they were skating on very thin ice was always in the back of their minds. Unfortunately, while in Mexico they had to deal with some health issues that brought home just how vulnerable they were with no insurance and living in a country where they had to navigate using another language. This experience crystallized for them just how important one's health is and how challenging and traumatic it can be to have to navigate a health concern when you work full-time, are new to the culture, don't speak the language, and know you can't afford care.

This stuck with them, and when they moved back to Oregon they were immediately drawn to Volunteers in Medicine. They loved how VIM was filling an immediate need in Central Oregon and how they were helping the most vulnerable populations (which they had encountered in Mexico). The Kronemeyers shared a challenging experience that many VIM patients face, and they say, "We are happy to support an organization that fills such a vital need in our adopted community."
